## Artist Statement

There began the slow realization that she wanted more than the local college offered. Her goal was set at becoming proficient in the fine arts of figurative and realization art. This is where she began the journey of teaching herself thru books, art workshops, and private classes.

Watercolors can be challenging but brutally honest. Today, her preferred medium continues to be watercolors and her preferred subject is figurative drawing. During her residence in Raleigh, North Carolina, Alva taught Art and Mural painting at both the St. Joseph's Hayti Heritage Center in Durham, North Carolina and the Durham Public School district.
