

ARTICLES ON ZONING TO BE PRESENTED

Attorney W. L. Pollard, Authority on Subject, to Discuss City Plan Movement and Specific Phases of Proposed Accomplishments

Beginning next Sunday The Times will publish a series of articles by W. L. Pollard on "City Planning," designed better to acquaint the reading public with the purpose of the city plan movement and what it purposes to accomplish. The articles will appear each Sunday in this section of The Times.

Attorney W. L. Pollard, author of the series, is regarded as one of the foremost authorities in the State and nation on the city plan idea, and has for many years taken an active part in this movement both in Los Angeles and throughout the State. The series will deal comprehensively with the subject, tracing the movement from its early origin through the various stages of its progress to the present time.

The articles will deal with the subject both in a general way and in detail. Specific instances of development also will be explained,

each article to take up some specific phase of the movement such as spot zoning, the extent of the police power in upholding zoning authority, effect of proper zoning upon the cost of improvement installation, and other elements of the plan such as streets and highways, public buildings, parks.

That Attorney Pollard is qualified to write upon the subject is evidenced by the record of his activities in the past and present behalf of city plan work. His record follows: 1926-7-8, chairman, Los Angeles Realty Board city planning committee; 1928-9, chairman, California Real Estate Association city

planning committee; 1929, special counsel Los Angeles Realty Board and California Real Estate Association, drafting and carrying at Sacramento Senate Bill No. 614, Map Filing Act and Senate Bill No. 615, City Planning Act, State of California; 1929, chairman special zoning committee, Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce; 1928-29-30, contributor to "Annals" of the National Association of Real Estate Boards; 1929-30, member of city planning committee, National Association Real Estate Boards; 1931, editor-in-chief of zoning issue of Annals of the American Academy of Political and Social Science.
