

# North Hollywood Gets Look at Master Plan

**NORTH HOLLYWOOD** — one-half block east of Lan-  
Leaders of this community kershim Blvd.  
got their first look at its new master plan when City Plan-  
ning Director John Roberts unveiled it at a meeting of the North Hollywood Chamber of Commerce.

Roberts said the proposal represented a "good general plan" for future development of the community.

He pointed out it doesn't assure immediate changes of zone but awaits the filing of individual applications. "Generally, it has not been city policy to initiate zone changes," he said.

The plan, which must be approved by the Planning Commission and the City Council, included:

—A mall along Weddington St. from Tujunga Ave. to

(The closing of Lankershim Blvd. to make way for a mall will be considered in the future," Roberts said. "Because of the present traffic flow, it cannot be considered now.")

—A play area for children near the mall, to be created by removal of an existing elementary school.

—Opening of new streets and alleys to provide access to the business district.

—Increased off-street parking — to 382 acres from the current 92 acres.

— An increase for development of light industry from 591 acres to 698 acres.

—A decrease in the area devoted to non-residential development from 8.7% to 8.2%.
